How do we create that vision? By working collaboratively with all the communities around the lake. By doing things differently and looking at issues with a clear sight line toward the end result. By focusing on accelerating positive change.

What we do:


The Tahoe Prosperity Center is uniting Tahoe's communities by working collaboratively across the Basin with two states, six government jurisdictions and numerous federal agencies. We are the only entity working strategically to encourage positive economic, environmental and community change in the region.

We accelerate and embrace change. Parts of Tahoe look the same as they did 20-30 years ago. That might work in the case of historical buildings and may be quaint or vintage. But, too much blighted, poorly planned infrastructure is still in place. We facilitate agreements between jurisdictions and partnerships with the private sector. We focus on solutions, where others see problems.

TPC encourages investment in Tahoe. Who wouldn't want to live and work in such a spectacular place? Tahoe's internet speed is too slow and cell phones don't always work, so many people can't live and work here. We are focused on bringing high speed internet to all underserved areas around the lake and are working collaboratively with cell phone/tower companies, agencies and others to expand cell phone coverage while minimizing the environmental impact. We see more roundabouts, bike paths, community transit connections and a Connected Tahoe.

We lead. Progress and change are not the problem. Status quo is the problem. Do we have all the answers? Of course not. But what we do have is the willingness to bring diverse interests together, to work through the issues, to focus on win-win solutions and to ensure a more prosperous, sustainable and healthy Lake Tahoe for all who visit, work or live here.







SUMMIT DETAILS

Discuss day-to-day challenges faced in the Lake Tahoe Basin while also stepping back to look at the bigger picture. Keynote speakers share their wisdom from the trenches. 


ASHLEY SWEARENGIN

Ashley oversees the overall management and direction of the Central Valley Community Foundation, ensuring that CVCF makes progress every day towards accomplishing our mission: to cultivate smart philanthropy, lead, and invest in solutions that build stronger communities.

Ashley Swearengin is president and CEO of the Central Valley Community Foundation, a charitable foundation serving the six counties of Central California and providing over \$100 million in funding to over 650 community benefit organizations over the last decade. Prior to joining CVCF, she served as Mayor of the City of Fresno from 2009 through 2016.

As mayor, she implemented substantial changes to improve the delivery of city services, revitalize the downtown and urban core, promote business and job growth, address chronic homelessness, and stabilize the city's financial position. Before becoming mayor, Ashley led a number of economic development initiatives in the Fresno region, including the Central Valley Business Incubator, Fresno State's Office of Community and Economic Development, and the Regional Jobs Initiative. She holds MBA and BS degrees from California State University, Fresno.

ANDREA CLARK

Andrea Clark is Vice President -Special Projects with Pacific West Communities, Inc., the affordable housing arm of The Pacific Companies (www.tpchousing. com); one of the largest affordable housing development companies in the country. As a former Deputy County Administrator and County Planning Director, Andrea brings unique perspective to private sector development. Since 2003 Andrea has specialized in tailoring housing development to the specific workforce needs of rural areas, high cost markets and resort communities, including Truckee, Tahoe and the Fastern Sierra.

MARK DAVIS

Culinary Director of the international Culinary School at the Art Institute of San Francisco, California, Mark Davis began his culinary career at age 15, working his way up from dishwasher in Concord, CA to Certified Executive Chef (CEC) at various restaurants and hotels across the United States. In 1987. Mark moved to Naples FL, where he worked for the heading a public (city/county) prestigious five-star, five diamond Ritz-Carlton Hotel. He specialized in Garde Manger practicing curing and smoking techniques, cold food preparation, food display, ice carving and charcuterie.

Chef Mark Davis is also a competitive Ice Sculptor recognized around the world for his innovation, style, and skill.

ROGER LEE

Roger Lee is the CEO of Economic Development for Central Oregon (EDCO), the largest private economic development nonprofit corporation in the state of Oregon. Lee has led EDCO since 1999 and past economic development experience includes the Seattle/King County Economic Development Council and economic development program in a rural northeast Oregon. A native of Idaho, he is a graduate of the University of Washington in Economics.

During her 30-year tenure living and working at North Lake Tahoe Jennifer has had the opportunity to work on economic development, housing, transportation, and land use issues from a variety of perspectives, including focus on both the economic and environmental health of the region.

Jennifer is the Deputy County Executive Officer for the Placer County, where she works on behalf of the Board of Supervisors with a variety of local, state and federal agencies, as well as private organizations, to shape policy and develop long range plans, programs and projects that meet the needs of a rural population that is a key tourist center and natural treasure.
